Roll Call Members in attendance were Pam Lee, Cori Radakovich, Wes Thompson, and Darcel Wesen.

Also present were Shirley Baumgartner, Health Officer; Jeff Alsberg, Commissioner; Cam Shipp, Sanitarian; Michelle Merritt, Director, Mykael Krebs, Jayme Due and Angie Peterson. The meeting included online Zoom and in-person participants.

Public Comment on agenda items – No comments received, no public in attendance.

Approval of Minutes – Pam made a motion to approve, Wes seconded and the motion passed.

Board of Health Mykael announced that she would be resigning her position and moving but introduced her replacement, Jayme Due, as the new Program Manager. Jayme has been in the office all month training with Mykael. They recently were in Frazer schools providing an MTUPP presentation and will continue to hit the rest of Valley County schools with the exception of Glasgow Middle School which will be done in the fourth quarter.

Pam inquired as to the status of measles in Montana. Michelle explained that we are providing ongoing education on Facebook as the state provides it to us, we monitor the state's dashboard daily and are fielding many community calls. We are available for MMR boosters as needed as well as attending the Child Find and scheduling kindergarten shots so that we can get students that second MMR asap.

2. New RN – Lydia Moore-Hicks (Starts 03/17)
3. New Program Manager – Jayme Due

Grants – all have deliverables, quarterly reports, yearly renewal of contract:

1. MTUPP – New TES Jayme Due (Updates from Mykael and Jayme)
2. Family Planning – Condom distribution: we have free condom grab bags at the front door with information on birth control, healthy relationships, and other resources inside
 - a. The grab bags are doing well
 - b. We have reached our client goal of 40+ patients 04/01/2024 – 03/31/2025
3. Immunization Action Plan – all IMZ – federal VFC/Vaccines for Children and VFA/Vaccines for Adults program
 - a. WIC list outreach – Monthly
 - b. Attending Child Find in April providing education, record requests, and to be available to schedule appointments for those who are due.
 - c. VFC & VFA contracts have been renewed
4. PHEP – Public Health Emergency Preparedness
 - a. CD/EPI – disease surveillance/STI follow-up and treatment

- b. LEPC/DES will be looking for a PIO after April 2nd 2025
- 5. **MCH/FICMMR** – Maternal Child Health/ Fetal, Infant, Child & Maternal Mortality Review of any death in these categories to look for preventable cause and endorse change in the community.
 - a. Newborn outreach
 - b. Education for new moms
 - c. Collaborated with the Valley CARE Coalition and put up a mental health educational board at the Annual Slash the Stigma Hockey Tournament
- 6. **DIS grant** – Disease Investigation Specialist/Health Promotion Specialist; funding for one FTE


Long-term Commitments

- 1. Cardiac Ready/AEDs – awaiting one set of AED Pads
- 2. CARE Coalition – 3rd Annual Slash the Stigma Hockey Tournament went well, raising roughly \$10,000
- 3. Hygiene supplies for VC schools – We will be pursuing funding, asking local foundations, starting in June, so we can distribute in the fall when school starts


Public Comment on non-agenda items –No comments received, no public in attendance.
